## Painted WBC Hives

We have heard from the Secretary of Lancashire BKA about these pretty WBC hives supplied by Chris Simporis in Clitheroe. The hives are custom-painted using Dulux Trade 3 Step Weathershield System (Guaranteed for 8 Years) with highlights in any colour you wish. They arrive fully assembled and complete, including:

- Brood Box x 1
- Super Box x 2
- 3 Lifts ( one with Porch)
- Metal runners
- Crown board with cut outs for 2 x porter bee escapes
- Gabled roof with metal cover
- 2pcs plastic bee escapers for ventilation holes
- Bamboo Queen Excluder
- Base with Varroa Floor including mesh with slide out inspection tray
- Entrance block with summer and winter holes
