There was an abundance of great raffle prizes and to round off the evening we were regaled by the Curious Incident of Doug and the Dodgy Caravan! (ask him sometime...).

Well our bees have finally quietened down and battenned down the hatches, although right up to early November they were flying like things possessed and bringing in lots of pollen. The three colonies I manage with Cliff (Porter) are strong going into winter, but there is cause for concern about food stores. This has not been a good year for the bees; the weather in spring was too poor for them to get out much, and when the weather improved there was little forage. We have given our bees fondant as well as a part-full super of honey on each hive and have started weighing the hives periodically (without removing the roof) with suitcase scales to assess changes in weight. Hopefully this will give us an indication of whether and when we ought to put more food on.

Fingers crossed we all start the 2016 season with thriving colonies. And remember, if you are new to be keeping, it is well-worth asking to be matched up with a mentor. John Heath is collating details of members offering this assistance so just get in touch with him.
