### Training and Qualifications

#### BBKA Basic Assessment

If you have been keeping bees for a year, then you should be thinking of taking your BBKA Basic Assessment. It is carried out by a BBKA assessor at a suitable apiary (not your own) and has two parts. A practical assessment (colony inspection and making a frame) followed by answering some questions with the assessor. The fee for the assessment is £18. It does need a reasonable amount of knowledge, so it is a very worthwhile undertaking. We will be running a course to prepare people for the assessment and this will consist of some correspondence-learning. We email you questions and then give feedback on your answers. So you can fit it in with your other commitments. We could also run group sessions or practice assessments if there is a demand.

### Meetings

The latest update of the 2016 Calendar of events is attached. Don't forget, all details are on the website too - just roll the cursor over the calendar at the middle right of the web page.

The talk last week on the Zest Hive, with Wirral Beekeepers at Thornton Hough, gave lots of food for thought. Bill Summers' impassioned claims for his invention of cheaper hives with better thermo-regulation, easier and more effective colony management and varroa-free beekeeping raised a lot of questions which we did not have time to discuss fully. Bill's concept certainly warrants further investigation. We were also introduced to Dr Latha Raly Vellaniparambil, who talked about her imminent post-doctoral research into honey bee forage and health. Some of us will be helping Latha with this research. She is still looking for volunteers to provide her with colony data and honey samples in return for information on colony health and which plants your bees have been visiting. Latha will be repeating her talk at our meeting on  $21^{st}$  March when we also have Graham Royle, our Seasonal Bee Inspector, talking about colony decision-making.

Not many members have so far turned up for the apiary sessions with Dave Harrison. But a few willing hands have made an impact, with the perimeter tidied up and a little more space made available around the hives last month and hives and frames cleaned this month. Details of the sessions planned for March and April will be circulated shortly.

# BeeCraft Hangouts

Since 2014 BeeCraft has been running regular 'Hangouts'. These are informal online discussions by a group of experts. You can listen in to the live conversation from 8pm to 9pm and ask questions beforehand or as the discussion goes along.
